Appendix. 'Whoever captures the kids owns the future'. And they are succeeding!

At present the church is responding with:



But 'not saying' says nothing should be said. Every youngster is now seen as potentially 'queer' and thus targeted by the 'All orifices --- vaginal, anal, oral --- are [tacitly] safe' messages. Bolstering this is the fact that non-vaginal sex solves problem teen pregnancy.

A selection of the issues we need to attend to:

- 1. High risk sex behaviours taught to all youngsters who are all now deemed 'potentially queer' --- non-heterosexual.
- 2. Spurious LGBT claims: A. 'Our relationships are just like yours'. B. 'We include all, unlike nasty haters like you'.

1. High risk sex behaviours

a. General

AOD.

Age of (Sexual) Debut. Ideally: Post PFC [pre-frontal cortex] maturation (early 20s), with its impulse control, risk evaluation, etc.

Female teen cervix: one cell thick, which is why, second to MSM (Men who have sex with Men), girls (15-24) have the highest STI rates of the public, followed by boys (15-24).

Numbers of lifetime sexual partners, and sequential or simultaneous sex?

Ideally: one partner. More partners, higher frequency of sex, greater risks and potential damage. With earlier sexual debut there is more likelihood of multiple partners and higher frequencies of sex with one or more partners.

Known risks.

Two dozen plus STIs/STDs, including those which are incurable, life-altering, disfiguring, and/or causing cancer, infertility etc.

Also, pregnancy, often ending in abortion.

Condoms give only limited protection to above, yet few realize this.

Risks also of addiction, as the teen body/brain is not mature and thus more vulnerable.

Sexual activity and kids: Summary¹

Teen sexual activity is also associated with increased risk-taking and other problematic behaviours such as drug and alcohol use and crime... When it comes to the effect of early sexual activity on mental and emotional health, Weed and Ericksen report: "Whether or not a pregnancy or STI occurs, sexual initiation has been associated with poorer emotional health for adolescents, including lower self-esteem, regret of sexual activity, depression, and suicide, as well as a higher likelihood of experiencing sexual exploitation, dating violence, and unwanted or forced intercourse/rape."

How is this remotely 'safe' or positive? However, it gets worse.



b. All sex acts do not carry the same risk! Do the biology!

Anal Intercourse, esp. RAI: Receptive Anal Intercourse, far more hazardous. Also anilingus (mouth/anus). Kink (pain as part of sexual protocols) is also potentially dangerous, but space limits me. Please email for this information.

Fragile anal sphincter muscle.

Because of the desire to insert objects or body parts up the anus and into the

rectum, poppers (a drug) are used to relax the anal sphincter muscle. https://www.lgbthero.org.uk/poppers

Porous, gossamer-thin rectal lining with no natural lubrication.

Tissue micro-tears not uncommon, allowing germ-laden stool access to the blood stream.

Content of semen.

Semen contains immunosuppressants, which increase the chance of infection and the development of cancer.

Re. STIs and pathogens.

Stool contains pathogenic bacteria, viruses, parasites etc. E Coli is always present in stool.

Re. HIV and Microfold cells.



Microfold cells in the rectal wall transport HIV to the lymphatic system and then out to the body.


Also, the rectal area: higher pH, which does not inactivate HIV.

This project was set up by Michael Fanner, a young guy who lives in Dorset, who has written and produced this guide. All of the advice and information in this guide has been read and approved by a number of sexual health doctors and nurses, youth workers, counsellors, psychologists, health promotion and education specialists and young people across the UK.

'Rimming

Rimming is when someone uses their mouth and tongue to explore someone else's bum. You might cringe at the very thought, but some people enjoy it. Some guys rim as it helps them to relax before penetration. It may be a good idea to prepare yourself before you get rimmed, and your partner* may find this better too. You can do this just by having a wash or shower beforehand.'

'Something to get anal about...

Lots of people have anal sex and for many reasons; some do it as it feels like they can get really close to their partner*, and some do it simply for pleasure.

You might hear guys saying they are a Top or they are a Bottom, or some even say they're Versatile—these are all preferred 'roles'. There are no rules as to which one you should choose to be, nor is there a rule to say you can't change your mind. It's all about preference and keeping yourself safe and happy.'

2. Spurious LGBT Claims

a. 'Our relationships are just like yours'. Really?

'Committed, stable, faithful' are subjective terms. Each couple decides what will be involved, and in particular, whether their relationship will be 'open' or 'closed' i.e. 'exclusive'.

If these quasi-marital relationships signed on to 'exclusivity', it would somewhat ameliorate the problem. However, that word has not been used. Heterosexuals have been taken in by the use of terms that hold a different meaning for LGBTs.

Having one's cake and eating it.

Traditional marriage has been and is still 'closed', exclusive, monogamous, one sexual partner till death. Though some---even many---may deviate, this has been

the norm over the centuries.



For Peter McGraith [left], the UK's first gay man to marry (2014), gay men are pioneers in creating better, more 'mature, rational and honest relationships'. This includes being 'open': 'over 50% of gay men's relationships are sexually non-exclusive'.

Leading national LGBT health charity, **LGBT Hero**, agrees. It comments on how over half their respondents had outside sex.

In its 'Infidelity and the gay community: Do gay men struggle to be faithful?' [image, right, from article] the answer is yes.
